



# THIS WEEK AT TEMPLE ISRAEL

September 3 to September 9 24 Elul to 2 Tishrei

Parsha of the Week: Nitzavim-Vayelech (Deut. 29-9-31:30); 9/2-8; Elul 19-25

Nitzavim emphasizes how all Jews, rich and poor, stand before G-d. In the future, we will be exiled, but G-d will eventually return us to Israel. The Torah is not hard to follow; it is right in our hands, so that we can study it. As for our choices, we must choose between death and life—that is, to follow G-d and keep G-d's commandments.

In *Vayelech*, Moses speaks of his own advanced age: 120 years old. He appoints Joshua as leader, and places the part of the Torah which he has written into the Ark of the Covenant (Joshua will complete the Torah, writing later of Moses' death.). In the future, every seven years, the people will gather, and their king will read parts of the Torah to them.
