In many ways our High Holidays are a kind of homecoming. We return once again to our spiritual roots, to familiar melodies and stories, to our community. Whether you are new to this community or have been here a lifetime, I say to you, "welcome home."

Our season begins with a special interfaith Selichot gathering on the evening of September 17 at the African Burying Ground, outdoors in downtown Portsmouth. The theme for this gathering is: Encountering the Divine Image. Offerings of prayer, poetry, music, and Selichot liturgy will address the spiritual aspiration to recognize the Divine Image in every human being.

High Holidays begin in our sanctuary with Rosh Hashanah on the eve of September 25. This year we are delighted to offer greater access to in-person and zoom High Holiday services. In addition to our regular indoor services we will once again offer outdoor Tashlikh ceremonies with shofar blowing in three locations on the first day of Rosh Hashanah. There are many ways to connect. We welcome you to join us in any way that feels comfortable.

# ADMITTANCE POLICY FOR THE HOLIDAYS

Temple Israel welcomes everyone in the Jewish community to participate in services and events. No one will be turned away.

Members: Pre-registration and a negative Covid test are required to attend services. To ensure that we can accommodate all who wish to attend, please pre-register by either contacting the office or signing up through the temple website. We will have open seating. We ask everyone attending High Holiday services to verify negative Covid status by taking a rapid Covid self-test within 12 hours of the holiday. Anyone experiencing cold or flu-like symptoms should participate remotely. Please contact the office if you need help accessing a Covid test kit; we have some available.

**Non-members:** Members' children age 21 and over (unless college students or active duty military), next of kin of members, guests of members, and non-members **DO** need to obtain guest tickets for Rosh Hashanah, Kol Nidre, and Yom Kippur services. To obtain guest tickets, return the attached form to the temple office with an appropriate donation by **September 19**.

Please read this holiday packet carefully for information on tickets and service times.

- Registration is required for members as well as non-members.
- Non-member tickets are required.
- Bags and backpacks may be subject to examination.
- All who can should access the sanctuary through the State Street upper entrance.
- The Court Street door is for handicapped access only.
- Leave all food pantry donations in the State Street lobby.

Ushers can assist families in finding seats once services are under way. Please wait until the congregation is seated to enter or leave the sanctuary and try to avoid walking directly in front of the *bimah*.

If you must leave the sanctuary during services, please use the State Street doors (or the elevator), NOT the two doors on either side of the *bimah*.

## WELCOMING FAMILIES

Temple Israel welcomes families with children at all of our services. Some toys and books are located in brightly colored bags in the rear of the sanctuary for children's use. We will also offer free childcare and snacks in our Early Learning Center for children ages 1 - 7 during morning services (approximately 9:00 am - 1:00 pm) on the first day of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. Registration for childcare (to help us plan for babysitters) is included in the online ticket reservation form or by contacting the office.

High Holiday family services for parents with children grades 1 - 5 will be held in the Social Hall at 10:15 am on the first day of Rosh Hashanah and on the morning of Yom Kippur. A special story time for preschoolers will also be offered in the Chapel on the first day of Rosh Hashanah and on the morning of Yom Kippur at 9:30 am.

# ANNUAL HOLIDAY TZEDAKAH DRIVE

We will dedicate our annual Erev Yom Kippur charity collection to Seacoast Family Promise (an organization serving families with children experiencing homelessness). Items may be left in the **SANCTUARY LOBBY (State Street)** collection boxes between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur.

**Items needed:** Skippy or Jiff peanut butter, grape and strawberry jam/jelly, canned tuna, individually wrapped snacks such as cookies, Cheese-its, Fig Newtons, fruit gummies, Goldfish, etc., pasta and pasta sauce, boxed mac & cheese, boxes of rice (NOT huge packages), pancake syrup and/or pancake mix, Special K cereal and/or Honey Nut Cheerios, coffee filters, liquid dish soap, **liquid** laundry detergent: please no pods. **NO canned veggies** 

Please check the expiration dates on food items before donating!

#### **COVID-19 PROCEDURES**

Our procedures are based upon levels of Covid transmission reported by the CDC for Rockhingham County at the time of the holiday.

- Please self-test within 12 hours of the holiday to ensure that you are Covid-negative.
- Anyone experiencing cold or flu symptoms should remain at home. Zoom access is available for all services.
- Green status: Masks are optional.
- Yellow status: Masks are required on TIP property and throughout services, with the
  exception of those speaking or reading from the bimah. Masks may be removed while
  eating during the Break the Fast.
- Orange status: Masks are required on TIP property and throughout services, with the
  exception of those speaking or reading from the bimah. Socially distanced seating will
  be available for family groups. Break the Fast will not be held in the building but may
  occur on a take-out basis.
- Hand sanitizer will be available and may be used by anyone going up on the Bimah.

## PARKING TIPS AND INFORMATION

Parking is very limited in the Temple Israel area. Temple Israel parking will be reserved for those with limited mobility, who can request a parking pass from the office for the holidays. We recommend that anyone who is able to walk should consider the **public** parking areas near the South Mill Pond, the High-Hanover Parking Garage, or the Foundry Parking Garage. These are your best options.

If you park near the temple (ON COURT ST. and STATE ST. ONLY) and get a parking ticket (FOR AN **EXPIRED** TICKET ONLY), turn it in to the Temple Office by Friday, October 7, with your name, for a waiver.

- This waiver applies only to EXPIRED tickets, only for a LEGAL parking space in this area, and only on Rosh Hashanah days 1 & 2 and Yom Kippur. Any exceptions to this mean that you pay the ticket.
- This waiver does not apply to Sukkot or Simchat Torah. Any tickets received outside of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur will be your responsibility.
- Parking tickets MUST be turned in to the office by Friday, October 7, or you will be responsible for the payment. Remember to write your name on the ticket envelope.

<u>TICKETS:</u> Membership entitles family members to two seats and single members to one seat at the High Holiday services. Additional seats are available for guests with a suggested donation. All suggested donations are per person, per holiday. DEPENDENT CHILDREN UNDER 21 YEARS OF AGE, ALL COLLEGE STUDENTS OR ACTIVE DUTY MILITARY WITH CURRENT ID DO NOT NEED A TICKET. The donation is PER HOLIDAY: Rosh Hashanah (both days) is one holiday, Yom Kippur including Kol Nidre is the other.
